

Data Available

Currently, the PCA Plus platform sits on 20+ quarters of data from the Maryland Health Services Cost Review Commission (HSCRC) & demographic data the U.S. Census Bureau. It contains Q1-2009 through the most recent quarter of data released by MD HSCRC.

Making the Move to ICD-10

The compliance date for ICD-10-CM/PCS was October 1, 2015. For dates of service or discharge that occur after that date, ICD-10 codes and guidelines replace ICD-9-CM diagnosis codes.

The following slides will highlight changes that healthcare providers will need to be aware of to be successful in the transition.



Note: ICD-10 will not impact how you report CPT and HCPCS codes, including the modifiers for physician services.

Why the switch?

The ICD-10 classification system is an expanded code set that will provide more specificity and clinical information, resulting in better data for:

- Measuring care furnished to patients
- Designing payment systems
- Processing claims
- Making clinical decisions
- Tracking public health
- Identifying fraud and abuse
- Conducting research

Specifying body part, approach, & device, such as: 047K04Z – Dilation of right femoral artery with drug-eluting intraluminal device, open approach 047K0DZ – Dilation of right femoral artery with intraluminal device, open approach 047K0ZZ – Dilation of right femoral artery, open approach

047K34Z – Dilation of right femoral artery with drug-eluting intraluminal device, percutaneous approach

Structural Differences

The ICD-10 classification system consists of two parts:

- 1. ICD-10-CM —developed by the CDC for use in all US health care treatment settings. This system uses 3-7 alpha and numeric digits and full code titles, but the format is very similar to ICD-9-CM.
- 2. ICD-10-PCS the procedure classification system developed by CMS for use in inpatient hospital settings only. The new coding system uses 7 alpha or numeric digits while the ICD-9-CM coding system uses 3 or 4.
